

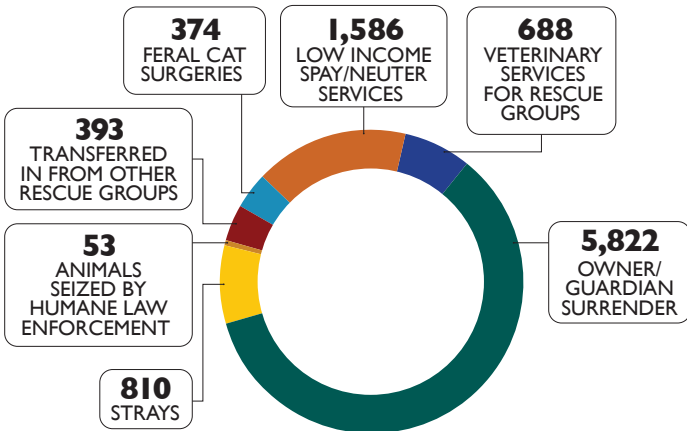

58 Pet Assisted Therapy Volunteers completed 213 visits and provided comfort for over 9,000 community members.

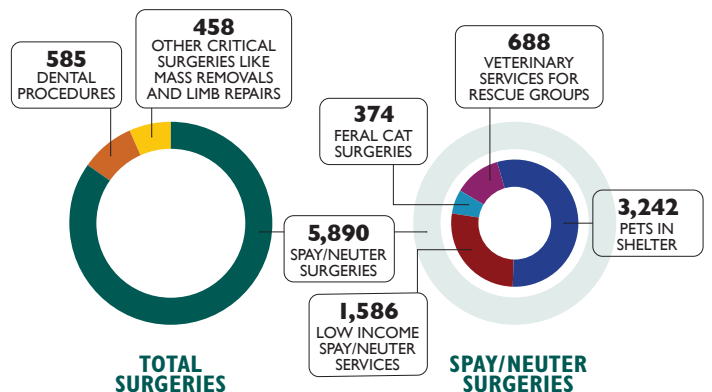


EDUCATION PROGRAMS

After waiting almost six months, your support helped Keira Bell find her new home just in time for the holidays.

Briar was brought to Lollypop Farm as a stray on March 21, 2015. He suffered from a broken leg and multiple ulcers in his mouth. Briar was placed with a foster care volunteer to provide him with the extra care he needed. He received 7 surgeries and over 20 examinations on his road to recovery. Briar finally found his new home August 30, 2016.

Keira Bell was surrendered by her owners on June 18, 2015, because her family could no longer care for her. Keira Bell received multiple surgeries and procedures for issues concerning her tear ducts, chronic ear infections, and severe skin irritation. The behavior team worked with her on manners to prepare for her new home. Keira Bell found her new home on December 13, 2015—just in time for the holidays.
